### **PROGRAM INFORMATION**

Students may not use courses with an ENG prefix to satisfy liberal studies requirements.

NAU GPA must be at least 2.5, with a GPA of 3.0 in all <sup>English</sup> teacher preparation courses, with no grade lower than a "C" to be eligible to student teach.

For the B.S.Ed. degree, be aware that you must have the following:

- a grade of "B" or better for the English foundation requirement (ENG 105 or equivalent) (If you don't receive a "B," you may complete an additional writing course, at the 200 level or above, with a "B" or better to meet this requirement.)
- a grade of at least C for the mathematics foundation requirement (generally MAT 110, 114, 125, or 155)
