For the B.S.Ed. degree, you must have the following:

- a grade of at least B for the English foundation requirement (ENG 105 or equivalent) (If you don't receive a "B," you may complete an additional writing course, at the 200 level or above, with a "B" or better, to meet this requirement).
- a grade of at least C for the mathematics foundation requirement (generally MAT 110, 114, 125, or 155)

POS 220 is required for Arizona certification, not graduation. May be waived by examination.

Students may only take lower-level FRE courses if you have not already taken advanced FRE coursework. For instance, after you've completed 200-level FRE courses, you can't take FRE courses at the 100 level; after completing 300-level courses you can't take 100 or 200 level courses.

Students must earn a grade of C or better in any course they wish to apply towards their major in French.
