Students may not use courses with a HIS prefix to satisfy liberal studies requirements.

Students must have a **3.0** cumulative grade point average in their history and social studies major courses.

B.S. Ed. Students must have a GPA of at least **2.5** in all of their NAU coursework in order to graduate. *Student teach*

Also be aware that, for the B.S.Ed. degree, you must have the following:

- a grade of at least "B" for the English foundation requirement (ENG 105 or equivalent) (If you do not receive a "B," you may complete an additional writing course, at the 200 level or above, with at least a "B," to meet this requirement.)
- a grade of at least C for the math foundation requirement (generally MAT 110, 114, 125, or 155)

Students must take at least one HIS courses at the 400 level in addition to HIS 430 and HIS 498C. *AND HIS 491C*
