PROGRAM INFORMATION

The primary objective of our communication studies program is to enable you to become an effective participant in a world in which oral, written, and nonverbal communication play major roles. We also offer activities in competitive speaking, oral interpretation of literature, and debating that are open to the entire university community.

This major in communication studies prepare you to enter professions requiring proficiency in public, group, and interpersonal communication; enter graduate school or professional schools such as law or theology; prepare for a career as a speech teacher-communication educator; use both theory and practice to communicate well not only in your chosen field but also in your personal life; articulate and defend your opinions as an informed citizen in a representative democracy.

Be aware that some courses in your major may have prerequisites that **you must complete** before taking those courses. You should create an academic course plan with an advisor and follow the plan to avoid delay in graduation. **Students must earn a grade of C or better in all courses required for this Communication Studies plan.**

Students may choose a minor of at least 18 units from a university approved minors or a certificate of a minimum of 15 units plus one additional 3 unit course for a total of 18 units. The certificate must be reviewed with a communication studies faculty before you begin the coursework.

As gaining experience in this field may be important when pursuing a career you are strongly encouraged to discuss the possibility of an internship with a faculty advisor early in your academic career. Internship credit is earned by completing an approved internship and enrolling in CST 408 before the internship begins.

You must earn a grade of "C" or better in the School of Communication ~~Core (COM 101 and COM 200)~~ and Liberal Studies required Foundation Freshman Composition (ENG 105 or equivalent transfer ENG coursework) and Foundation Mathematics Course.
