The suggestion was made at that time that the 100 level seminars should be distinguished from the 200 level seminars by having a different and appropriate prefix because this would make it clearer to students that a 200 level seminar course was different than a 100 level and that the requirements/expectations would also be different.

Our suggested prefix change therefore comes as a result of the recommendation from the UCC. We agree with this suggested change and request that these prefix changes be fast tracked.
