



Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

- Reduced tuition for students who are residents of 14 western states (Alaska, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, or Wyoming)
- The reduced tuition is 1.5 times the Arizona in-state tuition rate.
- All Northern Arizona University-Yuma undergraduate declared majors are eligible for this program.
- Students must attend at least half time (minimum 6 hours/semester).
- Undergraduate students attending Yuma campus (Distance Learning students are not eligible).
- Renewable up to eight semesters if the following is met:
 - Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA at Northern Arizona University-Yuma
 - Attend fall and spring semesters as a full time student
 - Complete 24 credit hours per academic year at Northern Arizona University-Yuma

Good Neighbor Policy

- Continuing students currently enrolled at Yuma campus that reside within 75 miles of Yuma pay Arizona in-state resident rate (no minimum or maximum hours of enrollment).
- New students enrolling Fall 08 at Yuma campus that reside within 75 miles of Yuma pay Arizona in-state resident rate up to 6 credit hours.

Northern Arizona University-Yuma Tuition Scholarship

Definition

- Tuition only scholarship that will waive the out-of-state tuition portion of Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) tuition agreement.
- This scholarship will equal 50% of in-state resident tuition.
- Amount will be pro-rated if student is registered less than full time.
- Fall and spring semesters only-not available for summer sessions or winter intersession.
- Scholarship will be awarded up to four semesters if renewal criteria are met.

Eligibility

- Student must be offered admission to the university, non resident, and reside within 75 miles of the Yuma campus.
- Undergraduate students only.
- Student must be enrolled with a declared major at Yuma campus (undecided are ineligible). Students may be enrolled less than full time under this program.
- In accordance with Arizona law, any person who is a citizen or legal resident of the US or who is lawfully present in the US may be eligible for specified financial aid from the university. Arizona law classifies any person who is a US citizen or who has lawful immigration status and is an Arizona

resident as an in-state student for tuition purposes. All students' residency must be verified prior to the disbursement of financial aid.

Renewal Criteria

- Maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA at Northern Arizona University-Yuma.
- Attend fall and spring semesters as student at NAU-Yuma.
- Renewable up to four semesters if above criteria is met.

How to apply

- Complete NAU undergraduate application for admission. All students are evaluated for eligibility at the time of admission. No other application is needed. Students will be notified of scholarship through award letter sent by the Office of Financial Aid.
