PROGRAM INFORMATION

The History-Honors degree includes the following requirements:

- ◆ **To be eligible** to apply you must have an overall GPA of 3.0, must have completed 24 hours of History courses and attended NAU for at least one semester.
- ◆ **Students must meet the following requirements to earn Honors:**
 - Earn a GPA of 3.7 in at least 39 units of History courses
 - Complete 27 hours of History at NAU
 - Complete an additional culminating experience beyond the senior capstone requirement, either a Senior Thesis (6 credits) or an Honors Project (3 credits)

***Please note that the History Honors program is different from the University Honors Program. A student may be enrolled in both Honors programs. Please see below for information on the University Honors Program.**

Students may not use HIS prefix courses to meet any liberal studies requirements.

Students must maintain a 3.0 cumulative grade point average in their history and social studies major courses.

B.S. Ed. Students must have a GPA of at least 2.5 in all of their NAU coursework in order to graduate.

Also be aware that, for the B.S.Ed. degree, you must have the following:

- a grade of at least B for the English foundation requirement (ENG 105 or equivalent)
(If you don't receive a 3.0, you may complete an additional writing course, at the 200 level or above, with at least a B, to meet this requirement.)
- a grade of at least C for the math foundation requirement (generally MAT 110, 114, 125, or 155)

In addition to your major advisor, the College of Education's advisement office offers advisement for your teacher-preparation plan after you apply to the plan.

***Please see catalog for approved courses. Students must take at least 2 HIS courses at the 400 level somewhere with in this block of major courses.**

GENERAL INFORMATION

- This degree progression plan is to be used in conjunction with the academic catalog and degree progress report.
- Students should see an academic advisor regularly to confirm their academic progress.
- Students must see an academic advisor before enrollment for the 7th term in preparation for graduation.
- Many courses have pre-requisites. Please check the academic catalog for pre-requisite and placement information.
- Honors students complete different requirements to meet NAU's liberal studies program. Students should consult an Honors Program advisor for complete information on fulfilling Honors Liberal Studies requirements.
- All students are required to complete at least 120 total units which includes:
