

Tribal Solid Waste Education and Assistance Program (TSWEAP) Training Opportunities



The Tribal Solid Waste Education and Assistance Program (TSWEAP) training program was initiated by ITEP in October 2006 with funding from the US Department of Agriculture. Our training mission is to create and deliver tribally-relevant courses for tribal solid waste professionals and to help them develop their overall capacity in the field of solid waste management. Our courses for 2009 will be:

- “Source Reduction Strategies for Tribes”, San Diego CA, January 20-22
- “Developing a Tribal Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan”, Portland, OR, May 19-21
- “Addressing and Managing Illegal Dumps in Indian Country”, Denver CO, July 21-23
- “Source Reduction Strategies for Tribes”, St. Paul MN, September 22-24

ITEP will cover lodging and per diem while participants will be responsible for their own travel to and from the courses. Each course will be designed for twenty participants and will include lecture, small group activities, and open discussion of the solid waste issues tribes face today.
